Skills we will be working on:

From 0 – 6 months

- rolling prone to supine
- grasping toy actively
- playing with rattles
- establishing eye contact
- responding to sound stimulation
- sitting with support

From 6 – 12 months

- standing, holding on
- pulling up self to stand
- begin walking with support
- finding hidden object using one screen
- using palmar grasp
- waving or responding to bye-bye
- playing simple “Peek-a-Boo” game

From 12 to 18 months

- throwing a ball
- “dancing” to music
- pointing to familiar things
- painting paper with paint brush
- practice using a spoon during lunch
- Pointing to one body part (head)

Ideas to do at home:

When out with your baby point to different objects and things while saying what they are.
