Science Experiment to do at Home:

Create Your Own Washable Dye

The FDK enjoys making their own washable dyes for different experiments. What you need

- Washable Markers
- Paper Towel
- Cups filled with water

Rip the paper towel into a smaller piece and use one colour washable marker (or more). Make sure the paper towel is dry before colouring. When finished colouring the paper towel, put the coloured paper towel into the cup of water and mix it and you will have your dye.

You can do many different experiences with this dye. Colour mixing with an eye dropper

and different cups, add it to goop or playdough or a baking soda vinegar volcano or even colour a sensory bin of water.



The best part is that it is washable.
