Eating the Rainbow

A fun way to encourage your child to eat their fruits and vegetables is to arrange them like a rainbow. Not only will they have a great time pointing out the colours, they can try a variety of different foods and maybe expand their palette.

Red: apples, strawberries, raspberries, beets

Orange: oranges, cantaloupe, peaches, carrots

Yellow: bananas, parsnips, corn

Green: green melon, pears, kiwi, broccoli, green beans, cucumber

Blue: blueberries, blackberries

Purple: grapes, plums, figs, heirloom carrots
