Skills we will be working on:

Gross motor:

Encouraging our little ones to take their first steps. Continue to motivate them while encouraging them to use their strength to walk, cruise with assistance and eventually on their own.

Self-Regulation skills:

Provide opportunities for the children to approach educators for comfort. This allows the children to learn that strong emotions and relationships can be formed in a positive manner.

Communication, Language and Literacy:

Expressive Language Skills

Imitate the children's vocalizations, encourage them to repeat or expand basic language and more sounds.

Practice using one word to communicate. Respond and engage with the children to allow for more interactions while promoting more language.

Mini Infant Obstacle Course!

Organize your play area with toys that can create a fun obstacle course for your children. Make sure the course allows the children to be able to use different movements to help strengthen their leg muscles enhancing their gross motor skills. For example, have them cruise with a push toy allowing them to reach certain toys in different areas and at different heights.



Gentle Reminder

Just a friendly reminder for parents to continue practising routines in the infant room. Keeping the same routine assists in supporting the children in their developmental and keeping things familiar for them. This can create a sense of calm and familiarity.
